What are some edibles growing right now?

watermelon, corn, tomato, cucumber, bean, beet, carrot, swiss chard, kale, broccoli, potato, parsley, basil, okra, fennel, squash, nasturtium, edamame, rosemary, sage, oregano, dill, tomatillo, cabbage, sweet potato, quinoa...

How about some of the flowers in bloom?

zinnia, sunflower, cosmos, poppy, jewel weed, rose, anemone, heart pea, cardinal vine, dahlia, cockscomb, petunia, chrysanthemum, hyacinth bean, rudbeckia, allysum, marigold, autumn clematis, lantana, cleome, sedum...
